#### 1981

An interest in family history and a commitment to genealogical research motivated Peggy to become a member of the Detroit based Fred Hart Williams Genealogical Society (FHWGS), Michigan's first African American genealogical society formed in 1979.





#### 1986

She introduced the concept of genealogical outreach programs to the community – workshops and classes were conducted in libraries, churches, recreational centers, YWCA and more.

#### 1990's

- As a member of the Society, she participated in numerous committees, conducted workshops, served on the Board of Directors, and served as Membership Committee chairperson.
- For several years, Peggy attended and made presentations at the annual Michigan in Perspective Local History Conferences and served as the assigned Delegate to the Michigan Genealogical Council.





#### 1999 TO 2006

Served as President of the FHWGS where she demonstrated professionalism, administrative capabilities, and leadership. Impressive contributions were made during her tenure. Under her impressive leadership, the Society revised and computerized the history of FHWGS, published biographies of the founder and presidents, updated the by-laws and the membership directory, and organized the archives.





#### 1999

Contributed to the planning and success of the Society's twentieth anniversary celebration on November 6, 1999

#### 2000

- ■Contributed to the success of Detroit 300, a celebration of the 300<sup>th</sup> birthday of the founding of Detroit
- Published the first of a kind publication, *Our Untold Stories: A Collection of Family History Narratives*
- ■Supported the creation of a commemorative 10 panel exhibition under the direction of Leslie C. Williams, current Society President, *Every Family is a History*, which depicts the histories of four prominent Detroit families.





#### 2001

- ■Joined in commemorating Detroit's role in the Underground Railroad through the dedication of two monuments; *Gateway to Freedom* on the Detroit side of the river and *the Tower of Freedom* on the Canadian side of the Detroit River.
- **■**Conferred Honorary Life Member title upon Margaret McCall Thomas Ward, Founder of the FHWGS.

#### 2004

- Contributed to the planning of the Society's twenty-fifth anniversary celebration, held on November 6, 2004.
- Assumed a leadership role in organizing the Society's first fundraiser at the Detroit Repertory Theater
- **■**Donated the Leontine Cole Smith Collection to the Burton Historical Collection, Detroit Public Library.







#### 2006

In her final year as Society president, Peggy received statewide recognition for her expertise in and contributions to the field of genealogy. Randy Riley, Special Collections Manager, Library of Michigan, Lansing, Michigan presented her with the prestigious Genealogist of the Year Award, at the meeting of the Michigan Genealogical Council.



#### 2006 TO PRESENT

In subsequent years, Peggy has remained an active contributor in her role as Immediate Past President serving as chair of the Special Projects Committee and the Archives Committee; coordinated book projects, served as Newsletter Editor, State Clubs Facilitator and Society historian, and assisted with the planning of the Society's 30<sup>th</sup> and 35<sup>th</sup> anniversary celebrations.




# **PEGGY HARD AT WORK**
